

INTRODUCTION

Reptiles are ectothermic, tetrapod descendants that live in almost all parts of the earth except the polar and associated regions. In India, three living orders of reptiles are represented - Crocodylia (crocodiles), Testudines (turtles and tortoises) and Squamata (lizards and snakes). India's complex geological history, current position in a zoogeographic transition zone, diverse climate, varying vegetation and different soil types form a wide range of biotopes that support a highly diversified reptilian fauna. Three global biodiversity hotspots – the Western Ghats, the Eastern Himalaya, and the Andaman and Nicobar Islands are endowed with varied and unique reptilian fauna.

First scientific herpetological study in India was done by Dr. Patrick Russell way back in 1790s (Russell 1796, 1801). The monumental works on Indian reptiles are, '*The Reptiles of British India*' by Gunther (1864), '*Fauna of British India - Reptilia and Batrachia*' by Boulenger (1890) and Smith (1931, 1935, 1943). The work of Smith stood the test of time and forms the standard work on the subject. Post-independence a few works (Murthy 1985; Sharma 1969, 1977, 1978, 1998; Tikader & Sharma 1992; Tiwari & Biswas 1973; Biswas & Sanyal 1977, 1978) contributed to Indian reptile taxonomy. In the start of 21st century, Das (2003) summarized the checklist of Indian reptiles and compiled a standard reference work on the subject (also see Das 2002; Daniel 2002; Whitaker & Captain 2004; Sharma 2002, 2007; Venugopal 2010a,b).

Subsequently, many new species were described (Das & Bauer 2000; Das & Sengupta 2000; Bauer 2003; Gower & Winkler 2007; Manamendra-Arachchi *et al.* 2007; Mukerjee & Bhupathy, 2007; Giri & Bauer, 2008; Giri, 2008; Das & Vijayakumar, 2009; Mahony 2009ab, Van Rooijen & Vogel 2009; Agarwal *et al.* 2011; Harikrishnan *et al.* 2012ab; Smith *et al.* 2012; Vogel & van Rooijen 2011 ab, 2012; Aengals & Ganesh 2013; Datta-Roy *et al.* 2013; Vogel & Ganesh 2013; Mirza & Sanap 2014; Mirza *et al.* 2014ab; Murthy *et al.* 2014; Murthy *et al.* 2015; Dandge & Tiple 2015; Srinivasulu *et al.* 2015; Agarwal *et al.* 2016; Agarwal 2016; Deepak *et al.* 2016a,b; Giri *et al.* 2016; Gower *et al.* 2016; Mohapatra *et al.* 2016; Sayyed *et al.* 2016; Giri *et al.* 2017a,b; Mirza & Raju 2017; Mirza *et al.* 2017; Vogel *et al.* 2017; Agarwal *et al.* 2018b,c; Chaitanya *et al.* 2018; Jins *et al.* 2018; Roha *et al.* 2018; Sadasivan *et al.* 2018), many new country-records were

documented and nomenclatural changes were effected, resurrecting synonyms, elevating subspecies to species and reallocating genera (Thorpe *et al.* 2007; Giri *et al.* 2009 ab; Pook *et al.* 2009; Zambre *et al.* 2009; Haralu 2010; Mahony 2010, 2011; Vogel & David 2012; Pyron *et al.* 2013; Vogel & Harikrishnan 2013; Cyriac & Umesh 2014; Ganesh *et al.* 2014; Guo *et al.* 2014; Pyron *et al.* 2014a,b; Vogel *et al.* 2014; Deepak *et al.* 2015; Guptha *et al.* 2015; Lajmi *et al.* 2016; Mirza *et al.* 2016; Srinivasulu *et al.* 2016; Pyron *et al.* 2016; Mirza & Patel 2017; Mohapatra *et al.* 2017; Agarwal *et al.* 2018a; Ganesh & Vogel 2018; Lalremsanga *et al.* 2018).

An updated checklist of 572 species of reptiles of India which includes 3 species of crocodiles, 34 species of turtles and tortoises, 231 species of lizards and 304 species of snakes belonging to 36 families is presented here.
